Directions: The meet location is 150 Knox Road. Do not use Buffalo Road entrances!

*Please inform all parents and spectators that our event is not at the Knox Park Buffalo Road location. *See parking map for additional information.

***Buses Parking** will be on Knox Road facing East-heading toward the village. Buses must enter the via Gypsy Lane from 20A/Quaker Road or Willardshire Road then to Knox Road. Buses are team shelters and in Case of inclement weather and should plan on staying for the duration of a school's competitions.

***Spectator Parking** will be at the East End of the Soccer Fields on Knox Road (closer to the village).

*The Spectator Parking Area will only be accessible from Buffalo Rd/Rt 16 via Gray Street (near McDonald's) to Knox Rd traveling West.

***Handicap Vehicles and Event Staff** may park at the West end-Equestrian area near the Start/Finish lines, Accessible only from Gypsy Lane or Willardshire Road to Knox Road. *Handicap identified vehicles will only be able to exit the handicap parking area between races and not while races are in progress.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.
